Humbleness - The Antidote To Pride

"God resists the proud, But gives grace to the humble. Humble yourselves in the sight of the Lord, and He will lift you up." James 4:6, 10 (NKJV)

We all know what pride can do - it is the root of all sin, and is the reason that every man, woman and child is born separated from God. It is the reason that Satan fell, and it is still the primary tool used in keeping the human race in bondage to sin. It is amazing to see how fast the enemy introduces pride at so early an age with our children as we begin to boast of them from the minute that they come home from the hospital. Our own seed of pride is cross pollinated and sewn into their lives as we start to brag of their achievements and begin to puff them up by telling them that they are somehow better than others - from academics to sports, to possessions and appearance, the mold is set and the hook of *pride* has been set.

"*Humbleness*" is the antidote to "*Pride*." It is the only thing that can defeat pride.

(Now the man Moses was very humble, more than all men who were on the face of the earth.) Numbers 12:3 (NKJV)

And it is the same for you and I.
