Breaking the Ice:

What actions would cause you to say "you are kind"?

For Reflection:

Patience and kindness like love are aspects of the fruit of the Spirit (Gal. 5:22). The first characteristic is love's passive response and the second is active initiative. Patience and kindness mark God, Christ, and truly Christian behavior.—Tom Constable

Definition: kind (covered in intro video)

kind ()chresteuetai be kind, usefulness

KIND

- 1. affectionate, loving
- 2. of a sympathetic or helpful nature, of a forbearing nature, gentle, arising from or characterized by sympathy or forbearance <a kind act>
- 3. of a kind to give pleasure or relief

Exploration:

Note: Patient and Kind are complementary terms. Whereas <u>being patient</u> withholds our agenda, frustration or judgment, <u>kindness</u> extends positive action to facilitate the agenda of the other. – JPW

- 1. How does taking the initiative to be kind complete what patience starts?
- 2. Where would we be if God were only patient and not kind toward us?
- 3. Can you think of some biblical examples of kindness?
- 4. Can you think of an example of kindness received and given in your family life?

Response:

- 1. Is there a person or circumstance that you need God's help to be more kind? Make that a matter of prayer.
- 2. Kindness cannot be produced by human effort alone; remember to rely on the Holy Spirit to give you the ability to love. (See: Gal. 5:22-23)

Bottom Line:

Find a way to extend kindness to someone as soon as possible and then thank God for the opportunity.
